#### Good-bye 2006, Hello, 2007

The year 2006 may have been a breakthrough year for the main goal of CRTC: to expand Metro Rail.

The development which portended better times for public transit in Western New York came from Governor Pataki. He acted to fill position on the Board of Commissioners at the NFTA.

In so doing, Gov. Pataki may have left a significant legacy for public transit in WNY.

The first appointment was Gregory Stamm as Chairman of the Board, filling the vacancy left by the death of Luiz Kahl. Mr. Stamm immediately made clear that he appreciated the work of the CRTC and promptly invited the CRTC to speak directly to the Board.

Next came Thomas H. Burton, advocate for the disabled.

Then, Kevin J. Helfer, former Buffalo councilman and mayoral candidate, who has expressed views supporting better transit.

A fourth appointment has yet to be confirmed.

In previous years, the efforts of the CRTC have been stymied by an uncooperative NFTA Board. No effort to expand Metro Rail can proceed without the leadership of the NFTA.

Therefore, the current makeup of the NFTA Board presents an opportunity for the whole community to push forward with the best Big Idea for WNY--expand Metro Rail!
