Buffalonians love their Metro Rail.

A recent Buffalo News article headed "City (Buffalo) leads U.S. in increased rail use" noted that Buffalo commuters are leading the nation when it comes to riding light rail to beat the high cost of driving. Metro Rail ridership skyrocketed 45.9 percent in the second quarter of this year compared to 2007. From April through June 2008, nearly 1.8 million passengers rode Metro Rail, up from 1.2 million in the same quarter last year. That's approximately 20,000 passengers per day versus 13,000 last year.

The NFTA's Douglas Hartmayer said "(These figures) are validation for what Metro Rail can and does provide for the people who use it."

What better reasons do our elected officials need for funding Metro Rail expansion? Light rail service beyond the South Campus terminal to Amherst and the U.B. north campus, to the airport, and from the downtown terminus to the southtowns, would give us a true light rail **system** versus our current single line that's only six miles long. No more subway would be involved. All of these expanded routes could utilize existing surface rights-of-way.

Want to help? Here's how:

* write or e-mail your congressional representatives and remind them that alternative fuels for automobiles are a good idea, but Metro Rail expansion would get more cars off the road, an even better way to conserve energy and reduce air pollution.

* ask candidates who want your vote to support an expanded Metro Rail system that serves all of WNY, including the suburbs.

The resounding success of Metro Rail deserves our support, through our taxpayer dollars and our elected leaders.
