Transit in Albany Budget

The yearly battle over the budget is in full swing, despite the many skirmishes over the governor's behavior.

The New York Public Transit Association (NYPTA)-- CRTC is a member organization-- has provided an analysis of the proposed budget, which shows that the current proposal would reduce the total NYS operating assistance for upstate public transit systems by about 4%.

The total NYS budget is expected to top \$134 billion for 2010-2011, while total NFTA budget is set at \$127 million.

Revenue raisers (dare we say "taxes"?) for public transit currently proposed by the governor include a hike in the mortgage recording tax for certain real estate transactions. Amendments to the budget could extend this hike to all real estate transactions, thereby generating needed revenue for transit aid.

The rationale for using the mortgage recording tax to support transit is: access to public transit enhances the value of real estate, therefore property owners should support public transit. This rationale was confirmed by a recent study by Dr. Hess at UB which showed the positive effect for property values near Metro Rail stations.

Figures compiled by NYPTA show significant improved revenues for transit systems through a modest increase in the mortgage recording tax.

Message to Albany: **increase operating assistance for public transit systems! **find creative ways to increase revenues for public transit systems (such as mortgage recording tax)! **make no cuts in public transit system funding! **CRTC Monthly Meeting**
