#### Leadership Required

What are the necessary ingredients for a successful turn-around of a Rust Belt city like Buffalo?

On June 1st, Green-Options Buffalo and others sponsored the viewing of the video: *Beyond the Motor City*, part of PBS's series, Blueprint America.

The film clearly laid out many trends and decisions that have led to the current crisis in Detroit, Michigan. The parallels with Buffalo, New York, were frequent and obvious.

Detroit is making strides to a better future, including investment in public transportation. What will push Buffalo to do likewise?

Panelist and main speaker at the event was the film's producer and director, Aaron Woolf. He offered three elements that are required for significant change in public policy: Active leadership, an impending/realized Crisis, and innovative Technology.

CRT would respond by saying that the innovative Technology for Buffalo is in hand: passenger rail modes, both light rail and trolley propelled by hydropower.

Add the realized Crisis: Buffalo rated as a center of poverty, amidst classic regional sprawl which tripled the land area consumed while maintaining the same total population.

The missing ingredient??

Active leadership, whose vision insists that a revitalized region must be a connected region, where clean and environmentally-friendly public transit facilitates access to jobs while supporting vital neighborhoods.
