More Transit = More Jobs Study Rings true in Buffalo

Led by VOICE-Buffalo and People United for Sustainable Housing (PUSH), over fifty people rallied in downtown Buffalo, 9-2-10, in support of the public release of a study, "More Transit=More Jobs."

This national study was sponsored by Transportation Equity Network (TEN), a coalition of 350+ grassroots organizations in 41 states working toward transportation equity.

The study found that "metropolitan areas that give a higher priority to transit generate more jobs per dollar spent on transportation."

Data for the study was found through examining Transportation Improvement Programs (TIPs) from twenty Metropolitan Planning Organizations. Researchers found that the proportion of transportation dollars spent on public transit ranges from 15 percent to seventy-five percent. The Greater Buffalo Regional Transportation Council (GBNRTC) serves that role in the Buffalo-Niagara region, and displays their TIP on their website, gbnrtc.org. Local examination shows that the GBNRTC allots 15% of transportation dollars to public transit.

TEN concluded that if regions shifted 50% of their highway funds to transit. the net gain of transit jobs alone would provide a significant boost to local economies--without requiring any additional dollars.
