Back to the future....?

The Congress for New Urbanism (CNU) is holding a retreat at Chautauqua Institution, and CRT will be there!

Why?

Because the CNU charter advocates for a community designed for access by pedestrian and public transit.

When the CNU visits Buffalo on 2014, they will see Buffalo's wonderful downtown buildings, built so that the population had easy access to the whole city-- via streetcars and passenger rail.

CNU may visit cohesive neighborhoods, such as Allentown and Hertel and Hamlin Park, which were built with the expectation that residents could walk or take a streetcar for their daily needs.

Perhaps they may look at outlying towns, such as Hamburg or Orchard Park or Williamsville, sprouted where the commuter rail line offered development.

Metro Buffalo was built around transit.

The Citizens Advisory
Committee (CAC) organized by the
NFTA met in late September. CRT's
representative is Elizabeth Giles, who
has chosen to travel entirely by public
transit. She reported that the first
meeting was taken up by organizational needs, and expects that the
next monthly meeting will begin
work on items of substance.

VOICE-Buffalo will advocate for increased public transit funding from NYS legislators at its public meeting, Oct. 28. NOAH will call on Niagara County to contribute funding for NFTA Metro services.

Several members of the **CRT Board** will attend the Congress for New Urbanism retreat, Oct. 12-14. While there, President Gifford will present the work of CRT and urge attendees to promote public transit as a critical element in urban planning.

Negotiations between the University of Buffalo and the NFTA are at an impasse, so UB students do not have access to a Metro pass this semester. Other local colleges which continue their student pass programs are: Buffalo State, Erie Community College, Canisius, Bryant & Stratton. Medaille provides Metro passes at full cost to students who request them.

Surely there is a way for UB to solve this situation. Metro passes work well for students who live near the Metro Rail stations, as well as for academic travel between the Main Street and downtown campuses.
